Tip-py Toes:

Caring for Children's Feet!

- ~ Keep their toenails trimmed. Always cut kids' nails in a straight line and check every week.
- ~ Choose the right socks. Socks that are too small can constrict toes and affect circulation.
- ~ Get the right shoe size. Children's shoes should be checked monthly to see if they fit properly. *The wrong shoe can cause blisters, corns, calluses, and ingrown toenails.* ALWAYS take your child with you when buying shoes for them.
